Employment has important impacts on well-being



Social, economic, health & criminal justice policy

Health & well-being

Social & structural conditions; opportunities, institutions

Most people's drug use **does not** impact their work

Some people who use drugs (PWUD) have **lower employment levels** and **higher job instability**

Employment is linked to the social, physical and structural environment



Without adequate income, PWUD often rely on **prohibited or illegal income sources**, linked to **harms**



Opportunity gap:

despite barriers many PWUD want **more** and **better work**
